Andrea Kárpáti (1955), is Professor and Head of the UNESCO Centre for Information and Communication Technologies (official title: UNESCO Chairholder) at ELTE University, Faculty Sciences, Budapest, Hungary.

She is member of the editorial board of three international educational research journals, served two consecutive terms at the Executive Committee of EDEN (European Distance Education Network), three terms as National Representative in IFIP (International Federation of Information Processing). She also served as Vice President of the International Society for Education through Art, (InSEA, an UNESCO affiliated NGO twice re-elected) and was Executive Committee member of the European Association for Research on Learning and Instruction (EARLI, twice re-elected).

She is member of the Educational Committee of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and founding Chair of its ICT in Education Sub-Committee. She has published 18 books, 60 book chapters and more than 120 research papers in five languages. She served as a Fulbright Research Professor at Northern Illinois University, US, 2009/2010.
